The Buckeye Central Board of Education held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, June 26, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. at Buckeye Central Local School.

Superintendent's Report and Discussions:

- Mr. Robinson reported that the auxiliary gym project is going well. The pre-engineered building has been erected and the roof should be installed by June 30. The masons are on site and making significant progress with the interior/exterior masonry walls. The project is currently on timeline and is expected to be completed by early November.
- The Quality of Life Action Team of the Crawford County Partnership for Education and Economic Development has asked the Board and district to consider a donation to "A Vision Plan Initiative" which includes a hyper web portal for Crawford County to connect students and job seekers to opportunities in our county. All districts in Crawford County have been asked to consider their support. Any donations would supplement a grant provided through the Community Foundation. Mr. Robinson will get additional information from the Partnership director in the upcoming weeks and a decision will be made for the August board meeting.
- Mr. Robinson presented an update on the summer projects to the board members. The projects, e.g. painting the baseball building & dugouts at the park, various school building painting, HVAC system upgrades, blacktop repairs, property upgrades are going well.
- Mr. Robinson reported that 79% of the 3rd grade students scored proficient or higher on the spring 2017 state reading assessment. One hundred percent (100%) attained the required score to be promoted to 4th grade based upon the ODE approved assessments. These scores are trending upward over the past 3 years.

- Written reports from the building principals and department supervisors were provided to the Board members. These one-page reports list and explain the many areas addressed within the building, grounds, or department during the immediate past month.
